Kempsey's recreational facilities are fragmented, old and limited



The Community Centre

- . KPC owned, built c. 1880
- . has one room for public and KPC use
- . accommodates Magic Moments Nursery & The Hair Gallery.
- . very limited and inconvenient parking at the rear





The Youth Centre

- . KPC owned, built c. 1965
- . has one large room and one small room for public use
- . limited parking
- . currently used by 9 clubs until 10 pm



The Sports Pavilion, Plovers Rise

- KPC owned, built 1980
- . very basic inside, not well used.
- limited parking



The Parish Hall (the Tin Hut)

- . owned by the Old Free School charity, built 1912
- . poor building fabric, limited life expectancy
- . little parking



St Mary Church

- . Very limited space
- . used by Church & Youth Groups

Sports facilities are limited to Plovers Rise



Football, cricket and other sports use the same grassed area, which degrades in winter causing some matches to be cancelled. The different sports also require different playing surfaces.


Housing numbers in Kempsey have grown by 500 in the last 10 years and the Parish is under pressure to grow further. The community now needs more sports facilities and variety to offer to residents.

This board shows some of the steps involved so far, from 2014 when a need was identified to "protect existing and provide new facilities" and "improve recreational facilities" for existing and future residents.

A site for a new centre was found and allocated in the Neighbourhood Plan together with extra housing to help secure it.

The land passed to the Parish Council, funds were earmarked and architect firms invited to tender for the project.

Reports have been prepared, pitch and building layouts designed and developed but always with the limited budget in mind!




The Parish Council Covenants


The 16 acres of land for the above community use were donated by the previous landowners to Kempsey Parish as an integral component of the sale agreement for land for the Taylor Wimpey 'Lygon Green' housing estate. The cost of the land to KPC was £1.

Location of the new community land

The site for the new Community & Sports Centre lies to the south of Kempsey Village, to the west of Old Road South and to the north of Pixham Ferry Lane at WR53NH It is outlined on the aerial view below.



The land owned by the Parish Council is shown in red on the plan below. The surface water drainage basin and the foul water pumping station for the Lygon Green housing estate are located on the site.





An artist's impression of the site when fully built, viewed from the west.



Formerly used for vegetable production, the class A soil is well drained and is deal for winter sports pitches. There are excellent views of the Malvern Hills to the west across the Lower Ham and the River Severn. The land is approximately 3 metres above the flood plain and has never flooded.





Access to the new Community & Sports Centre

The main entrance to the site will be on Old Road South, just north of the crossroad with Pixham Ferry Lane, for vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians. Coming from the north along Main Road (the A38), the preferred route by road to the main entrance is along Pixham Ferry Lane. Currently a narrow lane, work is due to start this year on constructing four passing bays as shown in the plan below.

An additional pedestrian access will be available as shown below.

There will be no access to the site across the agricultural hardstanding at the end of Pixham Ferry Lane.





Elevation views of the Final Building







Next steps for KPC and project partners.

- Review the feedback from this consultation and consider adjustments to the project as appropriate.
- Work with our architects to apply to Malvern Hills District Council for Full Planning Permission for the complete development of the site, including the 'Final Building' design.
- Once Planning Permission has been granted, progress the design details necessary to comply with Building Regulations and to issue tenders for construction of the Phase 1 building and the sports pitches.
- Seek other sources of funding to enable construction of the 'Final Building' and other facilities on the site.
- The layout of the site includes an area allocated in the south-west portion for the provision of a skatepark and a 'pump' track (for BMX cycles) to be included in the planning application. The area will remain as green space until a detailed design has been approved and additional funding can be secured to construct them.
- Continue to work towards a carbon neutral policy for all KPC's facilities in the community.
- Keep the community informed of progress
