**MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF KEMPSEY
PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 18th MAY 2015
AT 7.30 PM. AT KEMPSEY COMMUNITY CENTRE**

12. Committee Report Updates and Proposals

1. Environment:

- a. Proposal to proceed with strimming of the Rocky at a cost of £150 per cut, to be done twice a year – Item deferred until an Environment Committee is formed. Clerk to notify Wild Contracts.

Cllr Geens notified the Council that horses had been ridden through the Rocky area. This area is not a bridle path and the wooden bridges are not designed for the weight of horses. Item also to be referred to the Environment Committee.

2. Commons and Hams – Cllr Waller confirmed he had recently attended a Conference - Local Spaces, Open Minds and Changing Attitudes supported by lottery funding, focusing on Lowland commons neglect. He will expand on ideas at the next meeting of the Commons & Hams Committee. He confirmed he found the day very useful and was thanked for attending.

3. Recreation:

- a. Outdoor Gym Equipment – Resolved to reject payment of 50% deposit prior to installation and remainder on completion and agree on Terms and Conditions. Therefore the motion was not carried.

The Clerk is to make enquiries to re-negotiate payment terms to pay for the cost of the equipment on delivery. Cllrs Patrick/Gerrard to complete the questionnaire. Cllr Hodgkins kindly offered to examine the terms and conditions. Cllr Michael agreed to check the viability of the company. Item to be referred to the Extra Ordinary Meeting.

4. Community Centre:

A light fitting in the roof space has been isolated and removed from the Hair Gallery. The subject of the new kitchen fitting for Magic Moments Day Nursery was discussed. The Council resolved to grant permission for works to proceed subject to certain conditions as per Cllr Geens email communication dated 18th May 2015 and written confirmation that the contractors hold public liability insurance.

5. Planning:

Cllr Patrick reported on the following :

as

a) Application No: 15/00394/REM

Proposal: Reserved matters application for Appearance, landscaping, layout and Scale following outline approval of 14/00021/OUT for 106 dwellings.

Location: Land to the South of The lawns and Meadow Close, Old Road South.

Comments: We are very disappointed that Taylor Wimpey (Bight Farm) and Linden Homes have both proposed to locate the bulk of their affordable housing allocation next to each other. Linden Homes is on their eastern boundary, and Taylor Wimpey's is on their western boundary. Where they meet there is an almost totally affordable housing sub estate. We would like to see a more even spread of the affordable allocation throughout the development. Apart from this very important point we have no other comments.

The Council resolved to submit an additional comment to this application to state :-
To erect 2m high close board fencing to the boundaries of Meadow Close, prior to any development commencing, as a protection barrier.

Cllr Michael also confirmed he had made individual representation requesting the footpath be

b) Application Ref: 15/00474/FUL

Proposal: Erection of a wooden cabin to house a swimming pool to swim client's dogs.

Location: Hillview Dog Kennels At Hill view, 7 Old Road South, Kempsey, WR5 3NJ.

Comments: No objections

c) Application Ref: 13/01130/OUT

Proposal: Outline application with all matters reserved (except for access) for the development of up to 80 dwellings, formation of open space, formation of vehicular access and associated engineering

Location: 31 Main Road, Kempsey (Bight Farm)

Comments: When this site was originally proposed we were told that there would be large villa type properties fronting the A38, and overlooking the green buffer zone to help the development blend in with the surrounding properties. We were told that this was why the site was increased in size and this was why we didn't raise too many objections at the Outline Planning stage. This has not happened, and we are really not happy about it, and feel that we have been let down by the developers.

We are very disappointed that Taylor Wimpey (Bight Farm) and Linden Homes have both proposed to locate the bulk of their affordable housing allocation next to each other. Linden Homes is on their eastern boundary, and Taylor Wimpey's is on their western boundary. Where they meet there is an almost totally affordable housing sub estate. We would like to see a more even spread of the affordable allocation throughout the development.

We continue to believe that the attenuation pond in the south-east corner of the development could be a danger to small children playing in the area.

Cllr Patrick confirmed the application for the graveyard extension at St Mary's Church had been approved.

An appeal has been lodged for 76 homes at Post Office Lane.

Terry Ward – Post Office Lane

Pat Whitehead – The Limes

Highlighted the narrowness of the lanes on the approach to the Ketch roundabout which are very hazardous. Cllr Geens confirmed Highways and the County Councillor were fully aware of these problems. A re-audit will take place once works had been fully completed.

Linda Jenkins – Brookend Lane

Also raised concerns with the Ketch Roundabout requesting that we reiterate our concerns concerning the lack of road direction signage.

Bob Bowley – Kerswell Green

Stated he was surprised to see an item limiting speaking per individual during Public question time and also where this particular item featured on the agenda.

He made reference to Councillors being appointed to Outside Bodies due to a conflict of interest.

He also raised concerns with the April minutes item 7.7.1 which he felt were totally contrary to what actually happened.

Referred to the area ploughed, seeded and harrowed adjacent to the entrance to the car boot sale, at the Ketch roundabout. Are there any plans to bollard or protect this area? Could Highways ban parking until at least the grass has grown. The Chairman confirmed this area is not within our Parish however would address these concerns.
